# Moving Forward In 2026...



Stretto continues to explore new avenues for fundraising and increase efforts to raise money for events and operations. We aim to build on the fundraising successes of 2025 and continue ensuring that all students have equal access to the music opportunities Stretto provides, with the support of our sponsors and community. Stretto's 2025 Annual Gala provided another large boost to the Stretto Endowment Fund, helping to create a lasting method for providing quality instruction to students with top-tier instruments for generations to come. Stretto introduced a number of new fundraising events in 2025, and we plan to further build on these successes by continuing to find engaging events to raise money.

Stretto continues to work towards reaching a wider audience of youth by increasing recruitment efforts for our programs. Stretto's community is already broad and far-reaching, with our programs attracting students from along the East Coast, from Virginia to Boston. We aim to build on this established network and continue bringing in more students from all areas into our programs, especially for BMF. Stretto hopes to collaborate and form connections with other programs, teachers, and students around our communities to further grow our own programs and introduce our mission to those who may have a passion for music but have not had the resources available to them to pursue that passion.

With many students of Stretto graduating in 2026, we will look for our younger students to begin developing the confidence to be leaders. Introducing more events that bring our community together not only reinforces the connections within our organization but also showcases their importance and inspires our youth to maintain those connections, along with learning to be community leaders themselves through student-led fundraising.

Stretto's mission and our community's pledge to these values are what make the organization as a whole so successful. # Stretto

Stretto's continued success remains rooted in the generosity of our friends and community, and the support we receive deserves our most sincere appreciation and thanks. Stretto thanks Princeton Friend's School for hosting our weekly Friday rehearsals; and Trinity Cathedral in Trenton for partnering with us to present concerts and events in their spaces. We are also grateful for our most recent partnership with Christina Seix Academy, who we have been visioning with for 2 years. This Fall, alumnus and Trinity Strings faculty Jordan Lescouflair launched a strings program at the school for 100 new string players under the supervision of director Sherri Anderson. The Stretto mission has come full circle! Thank you to all of those who have contributed to Stretto's mission this past year.

Stretto is proud to celebrate another outstanding year of concerts with our teachers and students. In 2025, our students demonstrated their steadfast commitment to growing their musical talents while performing engaging and challenging repertoire for a wide array of audiences. Stretto performed their seasonal Spring and Winter concerts, a number of outreach concerts for other communities, as well as more focused events like our Juneteenth concert, Chamber Music concert, and holiday strolling as part of our collaboration with the Capital Health Healing Arts Program.

One of the highlights of 2025 was of course Stretto's United Kingdom Tour! Students were able to perform in historic venues like St. David's Cathedral in Pembroke and St. Mary's Episcopal Cathedral in Edinburgh, and further performed in and visited attractions throughout England, Wales, and Scotland. Stretto doesn't go on tour every 3 years just to say that we went somewhere new and exciting. The significance and impact trips like these have on our students - and even on parents or those in our community who join us - is immense. Those who come along are able to deepen their understanding of another community's culture, and appreciate both the similarities and differences between lifestyles.

Stretto has also been hard at work to bring a plethora of new and exciting fundraisers to our community. From events like Bingo Night, Community Flea Markets, and most recently our FUNDrive, we're able to bring together our community in creative ways that help Stretto raise funds to support our programs and mission. The money raised from these fundraisers continues to go towards funding new instruments, scholarships, and more to help give our students equal opportunities to learn and grow.

We'd like to also recognize the success of one of our more considerable fundraising events - our 2025 Annual Gala! Stretto was able to build off of the achievements of the 2024 Inaugural Gala, and we raised over \$18,000 for the 2025 Annual Gala. The funds raised for the event will once again be put towards the Stretto Endowment Fund to provide scholarships, instruments, and other materials to ensure that both current and future students have equal opportunity to study an instrument at a high level. We want to thank all of those who purchased tickets to attend the gala, as well as those who contributed additional donations, those who bid on our silent auction items, our students and alumni who performed at the event, and those who were awarded and recognized. Our award recipients of the "Alumni Achievement Award" and the "Service Leadership Award" in 2025 were Alexa Zammit and the Christina Seix Academy Leadership Team, respectively. The 2025 Annual Gala was both a festive gathering and a powerful demonstration of collective commitment, bringing together alumni, families, and others in our community who support Stretto's missions.

As we look ahead further into 2026, we are energized by the momentum of the past year's accomplishments and are grateful for the community that helps make all of this possible. We hope to see you at our upcoming events and concerts, and we can't wait to create more meaningful musical experiences with our students and audiences this year!



Blue Mountain Festival extends gratitude and thanks to our BMF partners and supporters, including those who contributed to the BMF Scholarship Fund, and the Young Professionals Fund that was introduced in 2025. Another round of thanks goes to Trinity Cathedral in Trenton and the staff at Mount St. Mary's University for generously hosting our day and residential camps and for their continued flexibility in accommodating the needs of our own students, faculty, and staff.

First and foremost, we want to congratulate our students for their exceptional work and dedication through the 4 weeks of camp in 2025. Inclusion and integration of learners from diverse socio-economic, educational, and cultural backgrounds are also at the core of BMF's vision. Our Scholarship Fund is a vital component in ensuring that all of our students receive the financial aid they need to seize the opportunity to grow musically during the summer break. In 2025, BMF held a Benefit Recital to raise funds for the scholarship initiative, once again featuring current principal cellist of Stretto, Alex Fiszer, as well as two BMF alumni - pianist Farshad Zadeh and cellist Owen Graham. BMF also introduced a Young Professionals Fund, meant to help provide beneficial materials to the young adults at BMF who are moving into staff positions, like counselors and junior faculty. This group is a foundational pillar for our summer programs, as they maintain a safe and secure environment for student growth at camps by supervising campers, assisting with chamber music, and ensuring everyone is included in each of our activities.

BMF invests in its young professionals because they keep BMF running smoothly each summer, and their responsibilities during the 4 weeks of camp give them experiences they can utilize further throughout their careers.

We recognize the importance of strengthening recruitment efforts to ensure that BMF continues to grow in both reach and impact. Expanding outreach to local public and private school music programs, to private studios of colleagues we're connected with, and even to our general community is something BMF has begun doing in 2025. It is imperative for the longevity of BMF that we continue to bring in more and more students into our summer programs.

Finally, we would like to reiterate how important it is for students to keep up with their instruments during the summer break. BMF provides a structured and nurturing environment where students refine their musicianship, maintain and build disciplined practice habits, and form lasting social connections that students take with them long after camp concludes. Post-camp surveys provide both numbers and anecdotes from students that points to over 95% of campers feeling a sense of accomplishment or making strides towards success. BMF is proud to be a program where campers are eager to return, strengthening both their musicianship and social connections year after year.

Unique to the Blue Mountain Chamber Music Festival experience is the extensive amount of individualized coaching and teaching each student receives. Students spend 4 to 6 hours per day in private and small group instruction with our world-class faculty, who are dedicated to both teaching and performing. A wide range of engaging courses are available to students, including music theory and history, college and SAT prep, and even entrepreneurship. The faculty and student performances constitute one of the most important and creative aspects of the program.



Part of what continues to make Trinity Strings thrive is the steadfast support of our community, especially from the parents and families of our students. Our program meets most Saturdays throughout the school year, and we need to extend a tremendous thank you to Trinity Cathedral in Trenton for inviting us to use their space week after week for lessons and concerts. We also want to thank the parents and guardians of our students who understand that a child's musical growth is built through consistency, encouragement, and partnership. We remain committed to working together to understand our roles and responsibilities in creating an inspiring environment for every child's education.

As a long time partner with the Trenton Thunder baseball team, Trinity Strings was incredibly grateful to be chosen for a community grant from the Grand Slam We Care Foundation! Our program was awarded with a check for \$2,000 to help fund scholarships and provide quality instruments for our students. Our Trinity Strings students even got a surprise visit from the Trenton Thunder General Manager, Jon Bodnar, and fan-favorite mascot, Boomer, who delivered the grant check themselves.

As the 2025 school year came to a close, our Trinity Strings students had the opportunity to showcase their individual progress at our June Solo recitals. From beginners to more advanced performers, the recitals highlighted each student's dedication and musical development over the course of the year.

Many of these students who performed in the solo recitals were likely accompanied by Stretto and BMF alumni and pianist Farshad Zadeh. Farshad also joined the faculty of Trinity Strings in 2025, as the program expanded its instructional offerings to include piano lessons! This addition reflects Trinity Strings' ongoing commitment to evolving the program in ways that add to and enrich the musical education of our students.

Our final addition to the Trinity Strings roster in 2025 is our new beginner group class! With our previous group class continuing to progress through their music learning and graduating to individual lessons, it was time to welcome a new group of students to the beginner class. The new beginner group class started with 5 students, and quickly expanded to 6 beginners who all performed for the first time at Stretto's Winter 2025 concert. Our young musicians beginning their musical journey on the violin are Calvin, Nadiyah, Jazmin, Noya, and Charlotte, while Violeta is the sole cellist of the beginner group class. Trinity Strings looks forward to all the growth and joy with our newest additions, and we are grateful for everyone that helps create a space where children can flourish.

Together, all of these new milestones for Trinity Strings reflects a year of meaningful growth for the program - one rooted in community support, expanding access, and a shared belief in the transformative power of music.

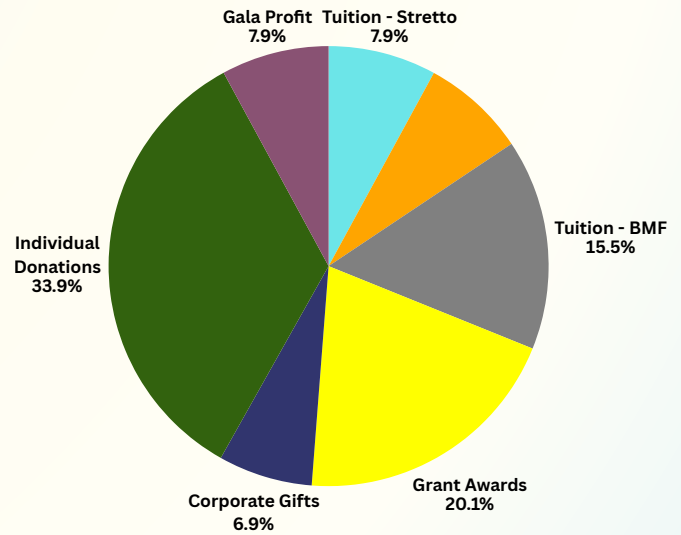
Trinity Strings is a string education program that welcomes children ages 4-18 and their families to participate in introductory group classes; as well as individual instruction, chamber groups, larger ensembles, and music theory for intermediate and advanced-level students.

Students play together as a group and learn to listen and communicate respectfully with their peers and instructors. Leadership opportunities are presented to students so they can build skills like strategic thinking, organization, and reliability. Students also learn to persevere and overcome difficult challenges by performing increasingly harder music, and it becomes extraordinarily fulfilling. Trinity Strings prepares students who fully invest in their music studies to graduate high school at a competitive, college-bound level.

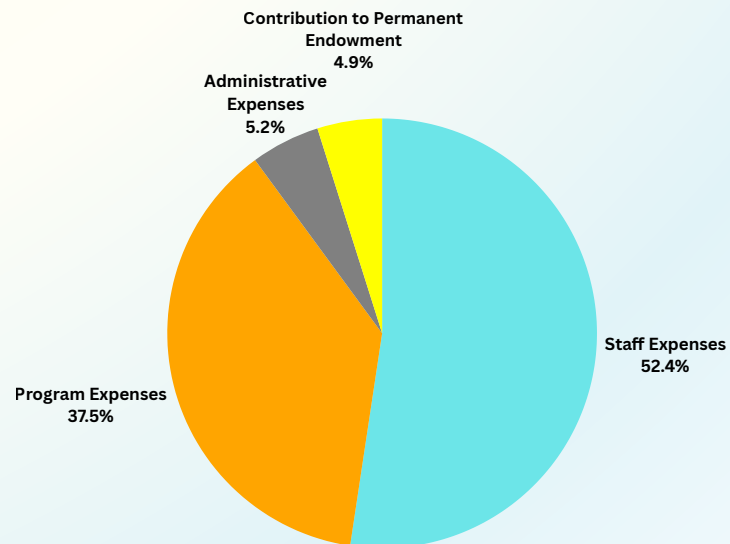
